We need your help learning about behavioral health resources for agriculture workers in the San Luis Valley

About Us: In collaboration with community partners, researchers at the University of Colorado Center for Health Work and Environment are conducting a pilot study to learn about resources and connections supporting behavioral health and total worker health in agriculture workers in the San Luis Valley, Colorado.

Who can participate? Agriculture adult workers (aged 18 years or older) including:

- Farm or Ranch owner and operators
- Farm or Ranch operators and managers
- Field or Ranch laborers and workers/day or seasonal laborers
- Laborers in packing and preparation of crops

What information are we collecting? In this confidential survey, we are inquiring about the individual and community resources and connections that agriculture workers have for behavioral health. We are also inquiring about behavioral health, stress, and anxiety, across the workforce to ascertain the extent to which resources and help are needed.

How will we collect data? Information will be collected from agriculture workers in a confidential online survey. The survey will take between 30-50 minutes and is offered in both English and Spanish. The survey can be taken from a SmartPhone, iPhone, tablet, laptop, or computer with internet access. If you do not have internet access or need help with the survey the San Luis Valley representative can meet with you to collect information. **Participants who complete the survey will be compensated with a \$40 electronic Amazon gift card or a \$40 physical Walmart gift card.**

What will we do with this information? Participants will be provided with individual results as soon as the survey is completed. Additionally, an aggregated community-level report will be provided to each participant. Individual participant data will be kept strictly confidential and will not be released. Individual results may highlight behavioral health and resources available and community-level reports can help behavioral health providers, agriculture organizations, and other community resources understand the extent of behavioral health in the San Luis Valley agriculture workers. All data collected is strictly confidential and will be destroyed at the end of the study.
